Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 19 20 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, 21 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll 22 23 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising 24 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, 25 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of 26 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and 27 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums 28 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on 29 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer 30 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee

The term 9 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the 10 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must 11 12 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case 13 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that 14 provided under the State medical assistance program.
