## AN ACT

- Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses), 42 (Judiciary and 1 Judicial Procedure) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further 3 providing for ethnic intimidation; in employees, further providing for definitions and providing for police officer 5 training on hate-based intimidation; and making an editorial 6 7 change. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2710 heading, (a) and (c) of Title 18 of 10 11 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, amended by the act of 12 December 3, 2002 (P.L.1176, No.143), declared unconstitutional, 936 A.2d 188 (Pa. - 17 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the offense of
- 18 [ethnic intimidation if, with malicious intention toward the
- 19 race, color, religion or national origin of another individual
- 20 or group of individuals, he commits an offense under any other

- 2 arson, criminal mischief and other property destruction)
- 3 exclusive of section 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism)
- 4 or under section 3503 (relating to criminal trespass) with

- 5 Section 4. Title 53 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 6 § 2173. Police officer training on hate-based intimidation.
- 7 The commission and the Pennsylvania State Police shall, in
- 8 consultation with the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission
- 9 and the Attorney General, develop and provide biennial training
- 10 on hate-based intimidation to police officers. The commission
- 11 and the Pennsylvania State Police may also consult with relevant
- 12 <u>stakeholders in developing the training. The training shall</u>
- 13 include, but not be limited to:
- 14 (1) Identification of hate-based intimidation.
- 15 (2) Methods to address hate-based intimidation.
- 16 (3) Reporting of hate-based intimidation.
- 17 (4) Hate-based intimidation recordkeeping.
