AN ACT

Amending Title 26 (Eminent Domain) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in just compensation and measure of damages, providing for compensation for loss of goodwill of 3 farm operation. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Title 26 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 717. Compensation for loss of goodwill of farm operation. 9 10 (a) General rule. -- The owner of a farm operation conducted 11 on the property taken or, if the property is part of a larger parcel, on the remainder shall be compensated for loss of 12 goodwill if the owner proves all of the following: 13 14 (1) The loss is caused by the taking of the property or 15 the injury to the remainder. 16 (2) Compensation for the loss will not be duplicated in the compensation otherwise awarded to the owner. 17 (b) Rebuttal of compensation. -- The acquiring agency may 18

rebut the compensation provided in subsection (a) if the

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- 1 acquiring agency proves that the loss could have reasonably been
- 2 prevented by a relocation of the farm operation or by taking
- 3 steps and adopting procedures that a reasonably prudent person
- 4 would take and adopt in preserving the goodwill.
- 5 (c) Leaseback agreement. -- If the acquiring agency and the
- 6 owner enter into a leaseback agreement, the following shall
- 7 apply:
- 8 (1) No additional goodwill shall accrue during the
- 9 <u>lease.</u>
- 10 (2) The entering of a leaseback agreement shall not be a
- factor in determining goodwill, and any liability for
- 12 goodwill shall be established and paid at the time of
- 13 <u>acquisition of the property by eminent domain or subsequent</u>
- 14 to notice that the property may be taken by eminent domain.
- 15 (d) Use of State tax returns.--
- (1) If the owner of a farm operation and the acquiring
- 17 <u>agency do not agree on the value of goodwill, the owner shall</u>
- 18 make available to the board of viewers or court, and the
- 19 <u>board of viewers or court shall, upon terms and conditions</u>
- that will preserve confidentiality, make available to the
- 21 <u>acquiring agency the State tax returns of the farm operation.</u>
- 22 The acquiring agency shall review the State tax returns
- 23 <u>solely for the purpose of determining the amount of</u>
- 24 compensation under this section.
- 25 (2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect
- any right a party may otherwise have to discovery or to
- 27 <u>require the production of documents, papers, books and</u>
- 28 accounts.
- 29 (e) Definition.--As used in this section, the term
- 30 "goodwill" means the benefits that accrue to a farm operation as

- 1 <u>a result of its location, cultural heritage value to the</u>
- 2 community, reputation for dependability, skill or quality and
- 3 any other circumstance resulting in probable retention of old or
- 4 <u>acquisition of new patronage.</u>
- 5 Section 2. This act shall apply retroactively to a
- 6 declaration of taking filed on or after January 1, 2022.
- 7 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
