## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of May 29, 2012 (P.L.549, No.54), entitled "An
- act establishing a Statewide stroke system of care by
- recognizing primary stroke centers and directing the creation
- 4 of emergency medical services training and transport
- 5 protocols; and providing for the powers and duties of the
- Department of Health," providing for Statewide stroke
- 7 registry.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. The act of May 29, 2012 (P.L.549, No.54), known
- 11 as the Stroke System of Care Act, is amended by adding a section
- 12 to read:
- 13 <u>Section 5.1. Statewide stroke registry.</u>
- 14 (a) Registry formation. -- The department shall maintain and
- 15 <u>operate a Statewide stroke registry using the American Heart</u>
- 16 Association's stroke care program's data set platform in effect
- 17 as of the effective date of this subsection and include
- 18 information and data on stroke care in this Commonwealth that
- 19 align with the stroke consensus metrics developed and approved
- 20 by the American Heart Association in effect as of the effective

- 1 date of this subsection.
- 2 (b) Data submission. -- On and after January 1, 2024, each
- 3 comprehensive stroke center, thrombectomy-capable stroke center,
- 4 primary stroke center and acute stroke-ready hospital shall, on
- 5 <u>a quarterly basis, submit data to the department concerning</u>
- 6 stroke care for inclusion in the Statewide stroke registry, as
- 7 <u>determined by the Secretary of Health. Data under this</u>
- 8 <u>subsection shall align with the stroke consensus metrics</u>
- 9 <u>developed and approved by the American Heart Association in</u>
- 10 effect as of the effective date of this subsection.
- 11 (c) Data access. -- Each comprehensive stroke center,
- 12 <u>thrombectomy-capable stroke center, primary stroke center and</u>
- 13 <u>acute stroke-ready hospital shall provide the department access</u>
- 14 to records, as the department deems necessary, to perform case
- 15 findings or other quality improvement audits to ensure
- 16 completeness of reporting and data accuracy consistent with the
- 17 <u>purposes of this section.</u>
- 18 (d) Contract and reporting. -- The department may enter a
- 19 contract for the receipt, storage, holding or maintenance of the
- 20 data or files under department control and management. The
- 21 department may enter into reciprocal reporting agreements with
- 22 the appropriate agencies of other states to exchange stroke care
- 23 data.
- 24 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
