Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who 2 3 desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and 6 cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs of the 7 8 Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts 9 by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," 10 further providing for duration and renewal of licenses. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 19 of the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, 15 No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, is amended by adding a subsection to read: 16 17 Section 19. Duration and Renewal of Licenses .-- * * * 18 (d) Renewal of the professional and teaching licenses under 19 this act shall require ten hours of continuing education per 20 biannual renewal period, with a minimum of eight hours in 21 professional skills and techniques, one hour in health and sanitation and one hour in legal matters, regulatory matters or 22

- 1 <u>ethics. Hours shall be submitted upon application for renewal.</u>
- 2 The subject matter of the continuing education course shall
- 3 match the scope of practice of the license held. A provider of
- 4 continuing education under this act must be approved by the
- 5 board.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
