## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of February 27 through March 5, 2023, as "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The goal of "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" is to
- 4 shine a spotlight on eating disorders by educating the public,
- 5 spreading a message of hope and putting life-saving resources
- 6 into the hands of those in need; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Eating disorders are serious conditions that are
- 8 potentially life threatening and have a great impact on an
- 9 individual's physical and emotional health; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Too often, signs and symptoms of eating disorders
- 11 are overlooked, and many individuals, families and communities
- 12 are unaware of the devastating mental and physical consequences
- 13 of eating disorders, as well as the pressures, attitudes and
- 14 behaviors which shape them; and
- WHEREAS, In the United States, 20 million women and 10
- 16 million men suffer from a clinically significant eating disorder
- 17 at some point in their life; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Clinically significant eating disorders affect
- 2 people across all backgrounds and include anorexia nervosa,
- 3 bulimia nervosa and binge eating disorders; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The 2023 theme of "Eating Disorders Awareness Week"
- 5 is "It's Time for Change," which focuses on the message that now
- 6 is the time for more equity, inclusion, access, outreach, early
- 7 intervention, education, representation, advocacy and awareness;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" is a collaborative
- 10 effort consisting of eating disorder organizations, eating
- 11 disorder professionals, health care providers, educators,
- 12 students, social workers, volunteers and individuals committed
- 13 to raising awareness of the dangers surrounding eating disorders
- 14 and the need for early intervention and treatment access; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Eating disorders are serious illnesses, not
- 16 lifestyle choices, and have the second highest mortality rate
- 17 for any mental illness; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Many cases of eating disorders go undetected, and
- 19 less than one-third of young people with an eating disorder will
- 20 receive proper treatment; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Eating disorder experts have found that prompt
- 22 intensive treatment significantly improves the chances of
- 23 recovery; and
- 24 WHEREAS, It is important for educators, medical providers,
- 25 parents and community members to be aware of the warning signs
- 26 and symptoms of eating disorders; and
- 27 WHEREAS, "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" encourages people
- 28 to share their stories and experiences with disordered eating
- 29 and body image struggles and highlight the importance of
- 30 screenings for early detection and interventions; and

- 1 WHEREAS, "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" also dispels myths
- 2 and present eating disorders as a public health issue that
- 3 indiscriminately affects many people, without regard for age,
- 4 gender, ethnicity, size or background; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Senate recognizes the vital role that "Eating
- 6 Disorders Awareness Week" serves in increasing public and media
- 7 attention regarding the seriousness of eating disorders, the
- 8 biological and environmental causes of eating disorders and how
- 9 to help individuals who are struggling with these debilitating
- 10 diseases; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of February 27
- 12 through March 5, 2023, as "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" in
- 13 Pennsylvania.
