

HISTORY OF SENATE BILLS

SB 1 By Senator BOSCOLA.

Printer's No. 5.

An Act prohibiting school districts from levying or collecting real property taxes after December 31, 2002.

SB 2 By Senator BOSCOLA.

An Act allowing senior citizens to claim an exemption from tax increases as to certain real property.

SB 3 By Senator GERLACH.

Printer's No. 7.

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for exclusions from local taxation and for the earned income and net profits tax; and providing for State collection of certain earned income taxes.

SB 4 By Senator GERLACH.

Printer's No. 8.

An Act authorizing counties to impose sales, use, occupancy, personal income or earned income and net profits taxes; empowering municipalities and school districts to require county sales and use taxes; and providing for the powers and duties of the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Department of Revenue and the State Treasurer.

An Act providing for an exemption from increases in school real property taxes for eligible taxpayers because of their age and income level and for the reimbursement of school districts by the Commonwealth.

SB 11 By Senators WAGNER, KITCHEN, LOGAN, MUSTO, COSTA and KASUNIC.

Printer's No. 15.

An Act providing for a school district revenue certification in counties of the second class; authorizing a sales and use tax for school district property tax reduction and a countywide personal income tax in counties of the second class; mandating a homestead exclusion; establishing a second class county school district property tax relief fund; and providing for the powers and duties of school districts and county treasurers.

SB 12 By Senators WAGNER, KITCHEN, LOGAN, MUSTO, COSTA and KASUNIC.

An Act providing for school district property tax reduction; and establishing the School Property Tax Reduction Fund.

An Act imposing additional sales and use tax and personal income tax; providing for real property tax reduction; establishing the Homestead Property Tax Reduction Fund; and providing for powers and duties of the Department of Revenue and the State Treasurer.

An Act abolishing the authority to tax real property and earned income; and authorizing certain taxes to be levied in lieu thereof.

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, further defining "local taxing authority" and "realty tax equivalent" for purposes of public utility realty tax; and further providing for effect of payment.

SB 16 By Senators PICCOLA, JUBELIRER and TOMLINSON.

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, further providing for annual budget, voter approval, additional or increased appropriations and transfer of funds; and providing for school budget voter approval.
