An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - **Children & Youth, March 12, 2019** **13**

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for penalties. (Representatives STEPHENS, MURT, POLINCHOCK and others) - **Children & Youth, April 16, 2019** **1**

This bill increases the penalties for mandated reporters who continue to fail to report suspected child abuse and broadens the "continuing course of action" provisions.

This bill amend Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

This bill provides for IRS Compliance for Employees who handle Federal Tax information.

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four, advanced metastatic cancer.

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in public assistance, further providing for verification of eligibility. (Representatives OWLETT, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - **Health, April 16, 2019** **1**

This bill amends the Human Services Code regarding medical support from noncustodial parents.

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and immunities, providing for contracts or agreements for nondisclosure of certain conduct. (Representatives TOOHIL, MURT, STEPHENS and others) - **Judiciary, April 16, 2019** **1**

This bill amends Title 42 to provide that parties may not enter into any contract including a provision that impairs the ability of a person to cooperate with law enforcement relating to a report or investigation of childhood sexual abuse, and that any such provisions in existing contracts are void and unenforceable.

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.
