(Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, June 12, 2019 **2**

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

This bill provides for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs.

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

1936 An Act amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, in contributions by employers and employees, further providing for contributions by employees. (Representatives HARKINS, COX, SCHLOSSBERG and others) - **Rules, June 12, 2019** 2

This bill amends the Unemployment Compensation Law to provide additional flexibility for the scheduled drawdown of dollars allocated for the Benefit Modernization project.

This bill adds two Certified Pennsylvania Evaluators to the State Board of Certified Real Estate Appraisers.

This bill amends the Consolidated County Assessment Act to clarify the procedure for counties to receive copies of building permits.

(Representatives SAPPEY, JAMES, MOUL and others) - **Local Government, June 17, 2019** **1**

This bill clarifies the procedure that allows municipalities to award contracts after failing to receive a bid.
