This bill creates the PA Dairy Future Commission.

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - **Children & Youth, June 12, 2019** **3**

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

This bill provides for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs.

This bill amends Title 34 to remove the restriction on the use of thermal and night vision optics for hunting.

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four, advanced metastatic cancer.

1630 A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, SIMS and others) - **Judiciary, June 18, 2019** **1**

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

947 An Act amending the act of November 29, 2006 (P.L.1471, No.165), known as the Sexual Assault Testing and Evidence Collection Act, further providing for sexual assault evidence collection program, for rights of sexual assault victims and for report by Pennsylvania State Police. (Senators LANGERHOLC, FOLMER, MARTIN and others) - **Judiciary, June 18, 2019** **1**

This bill amends the Sexual Assault Testing and Evidence Collection Act to expand the current list of rights for survivors of sexual assault to address anonymous submissions of sexual assault evidence and submissions for which jurisdiction is unknown.

This bill creates a new subchapter in Title 42 entitled Victims and Witness with Intellectual Disabilities or Autism.

498 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in depositions and witnesses, further providing for admissibility of certain statements. (Senators BAKER, FONTANA, MARTIN and others) – **Judiciary, June 18, 2019** **1**

This bill amends Title 42 to add a number of crimes to the existing provision which permits a court to admit an out-of-court statement of a child victim or child witness.

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

1936 An Act amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, in contributions by employers and employees, further providing for contributions by employees. This bill amends the Unemployment Compensation Law to provide additional flexibility for the scheduled drawdown of dollars allocated for the Benefit Modernization project.

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.
