This bill removes certain communications made in the presence of the state parole agents and persons holding a police officer commission employed by the Department of Corrections from the definition of "oral communication" under the Wiretap Act and extends the Wiretap Act until 2029.

This bill requires police to wear ballistic body armor for protection during high risk law enforcement activities and provides training.

This bill creates a grant program to provide financial support for municipalities that are in the greatest need of additional public safety measures and violent crime reduction efforts respective of their high concentration of liquor licenses.
