OVERVIEW:

House Bill 460 amends Title 34 (Game) removing the requirement that a hunting license must be displayed on one's back.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS:

Title 34 currently requires a hunter to display their license as identification, usually as a back-tag, whenever hunting or taking game. House Bill 460 will allow hunting tags to be carried on the person as a wallet-sized license, no longer requiring hunters to display the license on one's back.

According to the Game Commission, enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
