OVERVIEW:

House Bill 1175 is a freestanding act that provides for identification devices and subcutaneous implanting. Specifically, the bill establishes that no person or entity may require, coerce or compel another individual to undergo the subcutaneous implanting of an identification device. Any person who violates this act is subject to a civil penalty of no more than \$1,000 for each day the violation continues, up to a maximum fine of \$10,000. This bill also allows for additional restitution that includes actual, compensatory, and punitive damages.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS:

Enactment of this legislation would have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
