OVERVIEW:

This bill designates the Exit 32-B (Bentleyville) Interchange of Interstate 70 in Washington County, in both directions, as the *Nathan Burnfield Memorial Interchange* and requires the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) to erect and maintain appropriate signs displaying the designation.

The effective date is sixty days.

ANALYSIS:

According to PennDOT, it costs about \$1,000 to post signs designating an interchange. These signs typically last twelve to fifteen years before they need to be replaced. This cost will be funded out of the Motor License Fund from the appropriation to the department for state highway maintenance. The General Appropriation Act of 2008 (Act No. 38A) provides \$809,000,000 for this line item for FY 2008/09, and the Governor has proposed \$775,339,000 for this line item for FY 2009/10.

This cost is not significant enough to affect adversely PennDOT's budget.
