OVERVIEW:

The Combustible and Flammable Liquids Act (Act 15 of 1998) does not currently allow for any variances for emergency shut-off controls. This bill establishes new minimum and maximum distances for emergency shut-off systems and requires at least one attendant to be on duty while a self-service motor fuel dispensing facility is open for business.

The bill takes effect immediately.

ANALYSIS:

This bill provides the Department of Labor and Industry with the authority to issue variances on distance requirements for emergency shutoffs at self-service gas stations.

According to the Department of Labor and Industry, this bill would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
