OVERVIEW:

House Bill 2161 amends Title 34 (Game) allowing all license issuing vendors to sell reduced-fee military specific hunting licenses.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS:

Under current law, qualified military personnel must purchase their licenses from either the Game Commission or from a county treasurer. House Bill 2161 amends Title 34 to allow all Commonwealth license issuing agents to sell reduced-fee military personnel hunting licenses, Pennsylvania National Guard hunting licenses, and Reserve component of armed forces hunting licenses.

According to the Game Commission, enactment of this legislation could cause a potential \$5,000 loss in revenue resulting from individuals who would have purchased a license from the Commission but will now have the opportunity to purchase the license from any license vendor.
