OVERVIEW:

House Bill 2285 appropriates \$67,490,000 from the State Gaming Fund restricted revenue accounts and from the State Gaming Fund to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board, the Department of Revenue, the Pennsylvania State Police, and the Attorney General.

This bill would take effect immediately.

ANALYSIS:

This bill makes the following appropriations from the State Gaming Fund and restricted revenue accounts:

- \$994,000 to the Attorney General for the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses relating to gaming.
- \$9,942,000 to the Department of Revenue for the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses relating to gaming.
- \$19,536,000 to the Pennsylvania State Police for the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses relating to gaming.
- \$37,018,000 to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board for the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses relating to gaming.
