OVERVIEW:

Senate Bill 87 amends Act 287 of 1982, which governs residency requirements for military personnel eligible for reduced tuition at state-owned and state-related colleges and universities, as well as community colleges. The bill adds language to allow active military personnel and dependents to be charged in-state tuition rate for classes over the internet.

ANALYSIS:

Under current law, active duty military personnel and their dependents that are stationed in Pennsylvania are eligible for in-state tuition rates. Senate Bill 87 would allow community colleges, state-owned or state-related universities to charge in-state tuition to any active military personnel or their dependents who take courses from over the internet (regardless of where they live).

This change will have no fiscal impact to the commonwealth.
