OVERVIEW:

Senate Bill 206 is a free standing law that prohibits school districts from placing limitations on the wearing of official military uniforms authorized by the federal government, and imposes a penalty for violations.

The bill takes effect immediately upon enactment.

ANALYSIS:

The bill has no known fiscal year costs. There may be potential legal and enforcement activities which at this time are not quantifiable. However, this legislation requires a mandatory fine when a person is convicted which may offset any associated police and court costs. A person who violates this act commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$500, and that each subsequent occurrence in violation of this act shall constitute a separate offense.
