OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 925 amends the Massage Therapy Law (Act 118 of 2008) to require the State Board of Massage Therapy to approve accredited colleges or universities or private licensed schools or their equivalent to provide required training to massage therapists.

The bill would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: Currently the Board of Private Licensed Schools approves instructional institutions to train massage therapists. The authority to approve is being transferred to the State Board of Massage Therapy. The Department of State reports that there would be no fiscal impact to the General Fund and any potential costs would be absorbed by the State Board of Massage Therapy's existing funds.
