## **OVERVIEW:**

Senate Bill 976 amends Act 153 of 2004, which established the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System, to further provide for missing endangered persons. Under this legislation, the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) shall establish and maintain the Missing Endangered Person Advisory System to assist in the recovery of missing persons who are at special risk of harm or injury. This is to take place through prompt notification to the general public, appropriate law enforcement authorities and other agencies.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

## **ANALYSIS:**

According to PSP, they are able to absorb any costs associated with the establishment and maintenance of the Missing Endangered Person Advisory System. Therefore, the enactment of Senate Bill 976 is not expected to have an adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
