SUMMARY: House Bill 1126 amends the Judicial Code by adding a section concerning restitution for tampering with evidence or public records or information. It would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation adds provisions to the Judicial Code that would allow a court to require an individual convicted of tampering with or fabricating physical evidence, or tampering with public records or information, to make restitution to the victim for all reasonable expenses incurred. This restitution would be in addition to any other sentence imposed by the court.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
