SUMMARY: House Bill 1453 amends the Judicial Code concerning records of permanent value. It would take effect immediately.

ANALYSIS: This legislation provides for the reproduction of records of permanent value if the original record is being destroyed after reproduction. The reproduction format must be human readable, or, if the format is not human readable, the governing authority, in consultation with the county records committee, must create and apply standards, policies and procedures for the management of permanent records in that format.

The possible means of reproduction, including photographic, electronic, analog, and digital, are enumerated in the bill. In addition, documents previously recorded, copied or recopied may also be reproduced by any of these means.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
