SUMMARY: House Bill 1891 amends the Judicial Code concerning civil immunity. It would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation adds a new section on bowling center operator civil immunity to the Judicial Code. The section provides civil immunity to bowling center operators against any damages for injuries sustained as a result of a slip, fall, stumble or similar occurrence within a bowling center, where such injuries were solely caused by a substance or material on the bowler's shoes which was acquired before entering or reentering a bowling center. In order to qualify for this immunity, the bowling center must prominently display warning signs as described in the bill. This new section also contains relevant definitions.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
