SUMMARY: Senate Bill 86 amends the Crimes Code and the Vehicle Code concerning vehicle theft. It would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation repeals the Motor Vehicle Chop Shop and Illegally Obtained and Altered Property Act and codifies that language into a new Chapter 77 in the Crimes Code. Some changes to definitions are included in the re-enacted language in order to clarify certain issues in the new chapter.

Changes are also made in the Crimes Code concerning proceeds from unlawful activities, and in the Vehicle Code concerning investigations of garages and repair shops by police officers.

These changes are all designed to assist law enforcement in combatting vehicle theft.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
