SUMMARY: Re-designates certified athletic trainers as licensed athletic trainers. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act (Act 261 of 1978) to delete references to “certified” athletic trainers and replace it with “licensed”, and provides that all references in current regulations to certification or certified athletic trainers shall be deemed to be references to licensure or licensed athletic trainers.

Existing Certified Athletic Trainers will be deemed to be “licensed” and won’t need to apply for anything until their regular biennial renewal, at which time it will simply be called a license instead of a certification.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation would have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
