#### **SUMMARY:**

Senate Bill 1006 amends the Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act by adding to the list of controlled substances.

#### **ANALYSIS:**

Under this legislation, Salvia Divinorum, Salvinorin A, Divinorin A, synthetic marijuana, synthetic cocaine/ heroin, also known as concentrated bath salts, and psychedelic phenethylamines would be added to the list of Schedule I controlled substances.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The potential costs of this legislation cannot be determined at this time. While this could create additional costs for the Commonwealth to the extent that individuals are arrested and incarcerated for possessing and selling these substances, no reliable data exist to estimate what that number of offenders might be. The average cost of incarcerating an individual in state prison for a year is \$33,000 and the average yearly cost of supervising an individual on state probation or parole is \$3,000.
