SUMMARY: Senate Bill 1037, Printer's Number 1945, amends the Air Pollution Control Act to allow for the repeal of regulations related to gasoline volatility requirements.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends the Air Pollution Control Act (Act 787 of 1959) to direct the Department of Environmental Protection to initiate the process of amending Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan within 60 days of the bill's effective date.

Upon approval by the federal Environmental Protection Agency of a revision which demonstrates continued compliance with Federal National Ambient Air Quality Standards through utilization of commensurate emission reduction, the Environmental Quality Board shall promulgate regulations to repeal the provisions of 25 PA Code Ch. 126 Subchapter C (relating to gasoline volatility requirements). This will eliminate the requirement for the sale of "summer gas" or low Reid Vapor Pressure gasoline in the Pittsburgh-Beaver Valley Area from June 1 through September 15th each year.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this bill will have no fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
