**SUMMARY:** Allows minors ages 12 and 13 to be employed as youth sports officials. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

**ANALYSIS:** This legislation amends the Child Labor Act (Act 151 of 2012) to permit an individual who is at least 12 to be employed as a "youth sports official", defined as a minor who enforces the rules and supervises the participants of a youth sporting event, including, but not limited to, an umpire or referee. 12 and 13-year-old sports officials will not be required to procure a work permit and will be subject to the following restrictions:

#### During School Term

- Maximum 3 hours on school days
- Maximum 8 hours any other day
- 18 hours per school week and only at a time that doesn't interfere with school attendance
- 8 additional hours on weekends
- 7 a.m. - 7 p.m.

#### During School Vacation

- Maximum 8 hours/day and 40 hours/week
- 7 a.m. - 9 p.m.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth or political subdivision funds.
