SUMMARY:

House Bill 623 amends the Crimes Code concerning Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition (ARD). It would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS:

House Bill 623 amends the Crimes Code by adding a section that would prohibit attorneys for the Commonwealth from recommending, and the courts from authorizing, ARD under certain circumstances. The prohibition would apply when a defendant is accused of rape, involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, or aggravated indecent assault against a victim who was under the age of 18.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
