SUMMARY: House Bill 1310, Printer's Number 1774, amends Title 35 to prohibit the release of information related to an individual calling a 911 center. It would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This bill amends Title 35 (Health and Safety), addressing emergency telephone service, to insert a new section addressing the prohibited release of information. It states that in response to a request under the Right-To-Know Law (Act 3 of 2008) a public safety answering point or PSAP may not release a public record or part of a public record containing identifying information related to an individual calling a 911 center.

The bill also defines "identifying information" which includes name, telephone number, address and location.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this bill will have no fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
