SUMMARY: House Bill 1533, Printer's Number 2556, provides a municipal exemption from a leaf waste collection program if population and density requirements are met.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act (Act 101 of 1988) to exempt a municipality from establishing a leaf waste collection program if its population is more than 5,000 and it has a density of less than 500 people per square mile, provided it has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the burning of leaf waste.

If the municipality has not enacted an ordinance prohibiting the burning of leaf waste, then the municipality will otherwise be required to establish a leaf waste collection program under Act 101, specifically: 1) if it has a population of 10,000 or more; or 2) a population of more than 5,000 people but less than 10,000 people and a population density of more than 300 people per square mile.

The effective date of this legislation is 60 days after enactment.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this bill will have no fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
