SUMMARY: Makes several bridge, highway, and interchange designations across the Commonwealth. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation makes the following designations:

1. A portion of S.R. 663 from the Bucks County line through Pennsburg Borough to the end of Upper Hanover Township in Montgomery County as the Army Specialist Ray Ira Haas Memorial Highway.
2. A portion of S.R. 100 from Hereford Township at the Lehigh County line through Washington Township in Berks County as the First Lieutenant William R. Gendebien Memorial Highway.
3. A portion of S.R. 2026, also known as Blair Mill Road, in Montgomery County from Easton Road to Horsham Road as the Private First Class Paul T. Wright Memorial Highway.
4. A bridge on a portion of Sheep Bridge Road over I-83 in Newberry Township in York County as the Staff Sgt. Jason M. Faley Memorial Bridge.
5. A bridge on a portion of S.R. 879 over Trout Run in Goshen Township in Clearfield County as the Private David Kyle McCracken Memorial Bridge.
6. A portion of S.R. 2034 in Montgomery County from Terwood Road to Moreland Road as the Cpl. Carl F. Hynek III Memorial Highway.
7. A section of S.R. 145 in Lehigh County as the Cpl. Joshua B. Smith Memorial Highway.
8. A bridge on U.S. Route 15 in Cumberland County over S.R. 114 as the Cpl. Jonathan Dean Faircloth Memorial Bridge.
9. A portion of Byberry Road in Montgomery County as the Major Jeffrey Toczykowski Memorial Highway.
10. A portion of S.R. 1010 in Berks County as the DeLight Breidegam, Jr., Memorial Highway.
11. A portion of S.R. 51 in Fayette County as the Officer Richard Champion Memorial Highway.

12. A bridge on a portion of S.R. 741 in Lancaster County as the Corporal Eric M. Torbert, Jr., Memorial Bridge.
13. The interchange on S.R. 43, the Mon-Fayette Expressway, known as Exit 4, in Fayette County as the Master Sergeant Arthur L. Lilley Memorial Interchange.
14. The bridge on S.R. 770 over the Tunungwant Creek in McKean County as the Master Sergeant Thomas Maholic Memorial Bridge.
15. A bridge to be constructed along S.R. 6 over Dingman Run, Potter County as the PFC George Pesock Memorial Bridge.
16. A portion of S.R. 872 over Bailey Run in Wharton Township, Potter County as the Sgt. Paul M. Brown Memorial Highway.
17. The interchange of Interstate 70 and PA Route 119 in New Stanton Borough, Westmoreland County, as the E. Jeffrey Wentzel Memorial Interchange.
18. A portion of S.R. 220 in Lycoming and Sullivan counties as the Lieutenant Commander John J. Peterman Memorial Highway;
19. A portion of S.R. 220 in Lycoming County as the Thomas A. Paternostro Memorial Highway
20. A portion of S.R. 4005 in Jefferson County as the Polk Township Veterans Memorial Bridge.

The legislation also repeals the designations from Act 46 of 2016 including the Corporal Jonathan Dean Faircloth designation but reestablishes it with technical changes.

PennDOT and the Turnpike Commission shall be responsible for erecting and maintaining appropriate signs displaying these designations to traffic in both directions.

FISCAL IMPACT: According to PennDOT, installation of 2 signs, 1 in each direction, dedicating a bridge, highway, or interchange costs \$500. PennDOT would be responsible for 19 designations within this legislation, therefore its costs would total \$9,500. The Turnpike Commission would be responsible for one designation, therefore its costs would be \$500. All costs can be absorbed in currently allocated funds.
