SUMMARY: House Bill 302, Printer's Number 302, amends Title 51 by including the Department of Health in the list of agencies required to provide an exemption from continuing education requirements for persons licensed or certified by such agencies who are called to active duty.

ANALYSIS: This bill amends Title 51 (Military Affairs) to address the retention of licenses and certifications of persons entering military service, specifically requiring the Department of Health to provide an exemption from continuing education requirements for persons licensed or certified who are called to active duty. Such persons will be exempt from continuing educational requirements or in-service training requirements, and will not forfeit their current license/registration.

The Department of Health is added to the list of agencies that provide such exemptions, which include the Department of State, Department of Labor and Industry, Department of Education, Insurance Department, Department of Banking and the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission.

This legislation would take effect in 60 days upon enactment.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this bill will have no fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
