SUMMARY: Amends Title 75 (Vehicle Code) to delegate powers to parking authorities of cities of the second class A and third class. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation amends the Vehicle Code to provide second class A and third class cities with the option to administer and enforce parking ordinances through a parking authority. The legislation would permit these parking authorities to oversee administrative hearings conducted by personnel instead of criminal courts to adjudicate parking violations.

The legislation specifically amends Section 6109 of Title 75 to add a subsection (i) that states that, beginning January 1, 2018, a parking authority of a city of the second class A or city of the third class may enforce and administer ordinances and resolutions by the city as provided for in Section 6109(a)(1) pertaining to certain stopping, standing and parking provisions, including sections 3351, 3353 and 3354. The legislation further provides that a parking authority, beginning March 1, 2018, may enter into an agreement with the city for the transfer of a portion of the fines, penalties and costs collected, which the parking authority deems reasonable, to the city.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth, second class A or third class cities or parking authorities.
