SUMMARY: Amends Title 34 (Game) to provide for expanded availability of hunter education courses in public schools, through the use of school facilities at the request of the PA Game Commission.

ANALYSIS: HB 102 will amend Section 2704 (relating to eligibility for license) by adding a new subsection (g) to provide that, upon request of the PA Game Commission, public school districts are required to make a school facility under their control available for the purpose of conducting a hunter education course. Classes may occur as an after-school or weekend function or any other day when school is not in session. Classes must comply with curriculum standards and program policies established by the director of the commission. The PA Game Commission must compensate the school for the actual cost related to the commission's use of the school facility, and must work with the school to schedule classes for a time-frame that best suits both the school and the commission. No fees may be charged to the public for the classes.

Effective date: 60 days

FISCAL IMPACT: Although the PA Game Commission already provides reimbursement to the facilities that host hunter education courses, this legislation could have a minimal fiscal impact on the Game Fund if the number of courses offered rises due to increased availability of school facilities.
