SUMMARY: Repeals Act 308 of 1933 known as the Sunday Music Act, providing for musicians to receive compensation for singing or playing on Sunday in connection with public concerts. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation would repeal the Sunday Music Act of 1933. The Sunday Music Act provides for any musician to receive compensation for singing or playing on Sunday in connection with the rendering of any public concert. Public concerts may be rendered and broadcast on Sunday after 12 o'clock noon. Anyone rendering such concert may charge an admission fee at a rate to cover the expenses of the concert. Money collected exceeding actual expenses shall be paid to the Department of Public Instruction.

FISCAL IMPACT: This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth or political subdivision funds.
