SUMMARY:

House Bill 1772, Printer's Number 2821 amends Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) further providing for the type of notice that may be provided under Section 3503 (b) (Criminal trespass-Defiant trespasser).

ANALYSIS:

HB 1772 amends the Crimes Code to allow a property owner to use identifying purple paint marks on trees or posts to provide notice not to trespass on the property. Section 3503 (b)(1)(vi) would not apply to counties of the first and second class. In addition, this section would not apply to any unarmed person who enters onto posted property for the sole purpose of retrieving a hunting dog.

This legislation would take effect in 60 days after enactment.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
