SUMMARY: House Bill 2100, Printer's Number 4380, establishes the September 11th Remembrance Day Act and provides for veteran recognition.

ANALYSIS: This bill establishes "September 11th Remembrance Day" to recognize September 11 annually in this Commonwealth. It states that "September 11th Remembrance Day" shall be observed in every public school entity and during every public meeting by a brief period of silence to remember the victims of the terrorist attacks that occurred on September 11, 2001.

Chapter 5 is added to provide for veteran recognition, specifically the contributions of veterans of the United States Armed Forces from Pennsylvania in major conflicts since the Vietnam War. This includes recognition of "Persian Gulf War Veterans Day" and "Global War on Terrorism Veterans Day."

The bill also provides for the following definitions:

- "Public meeting." Any meeting open to the public under 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to open meetings).
- "Public school entity." Any public school, charter school, regional charter school, cyber charter school, intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school.

This legislation would take effect in 60 days upon enactment.

FISCAL IMPACT: Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
