#### **SUMMARY:**

House Bill 2177 amends the Judicial Code concerning sexual offender treatment. It would take effect in 60 days.

### **ANALYSIS**:

House Bill 2177 amends the Judicial Code by expanding the list of offenses that require an offender in a State Correctional Institution to attend and participate in a Department of Corrections program of counseling or therapy designed for incarcerated sex offenders. Offenses added include any related to human trafficking if the victim is under 18 and the offense involved sexual servitude, endangering the welfare of children, corruption of minors, and incest.

This legislation also makes participation in these programs a condition of eligibility for parole for these offenders.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

According to the Department of Corrections, enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
