#### SUMMARY:

House Bill 2646 amends the Public School Code concerning out-of-state applicants for career and technical education certificates. It would take effect in 60 days.

#### ANALYSIS:

House Bill 2646 amends the Public School Code by adding a new section concerning out-of-state applicants for career and technical education certificates. It would require the Department of Education to issue Career and Technical Instructional I Certificates to out-of-State candidates who hold a valid career and technical instructional certificate or equivalent certificate from another state, have completed at least four years wage-earning experience in the occupation to be taught, have at least two years of satisfactory teaching experience, and meet all other requirements in the School Code. The Career and Technical Instructional I Certificate will be valid for eight annual school terms, after which it will be converted to a Career and Technical Instructional II Certificate in accordance with current law. These certificates must be issued on an expedited basis.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

Enactment of this legislation will have no adverse impact on Commonwealth funds.
