SUMMARY: Designates multiple bridges, highways, and interchanges throughout Pennsylvania. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

ANALYSIS: This legislation makes the following designations:

- A bridge, identified as Bridge Key 31419 and Bridge Key 31420, on that portion of U.S. Route 219 over State Route 601 in Somerset County as the Corporal Anthony G. Orlandi Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge on State Route 4001 over Crooked Creek Indiana County as the Sergeant Carl Roof Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge on State Route 1011 in McKean County as the Sgt. Neil K. Dorrien Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge over the Allegheny River in Potter County as the SSG Gerrith Kibbe Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge in Cambria County as the Seaman 2nd Class Louis J. Benzie WWII Memorial Bridge.
- A portion of State Route 2038 as the CPL Vincent J. Wargo, Jr., U.S.M.C. Memorial Highway.
- A bridge in Cambria County as the Technical Sergeant Mike Capelli Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge carrying a portion of U.S. Route 219 over Pennsylvania Route 53 in Cambria County as the Janice Keen-Livingston First Responders' Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge over the Tioga River in Tioga County as the Mansfield Veterans Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge on S.R. 4010 in Blair County as the Honorable Richard A. Geist Memorial Bridge.
- The portion of Pennsylvania Route 837 between Center Street in the City of Duquesne, Allegheny County, and Hoffman Boulevard in West Mifflin Borough, Allegheny County, as the Clifton P. Pitts Memorial Highway.
- A portion of State Route 4014 in Erie County as the John A. Pulice Memorial Highway
- A bridge carrying State Route 2027 in Fayette County as the SSG Willis J. Crayton Memorial Bridge.

- A bridge carrying State Route 913 over the Juniata River in Bedford County as the Sergeant Charles Warsing Memorial Bridge.
- A bridge carrying State Route 2047 over CSX and SEPTA Railroads in Bucks County as the PFC John Elton Candy, Memorial Bridge.
- An entire portion of US Route 20 in Pennsylvania, beginning at the Pennsylvania-Ohio State Line and ending at the Pennsylvania-New York State Line, as the Pennsylvania Medal of Honor Highway.
 - Language was added to specify that PennDOT shall erect and maintain appropriate signs, brown with white trim and lettering, displaying the name of the highway to traffic in each direction of the route near the borders of Ohio and New York. The sign shall also display the army, navy and air force medals of honor.
- The interchange of State Route 43 in Fayette County, as the PFC Joseph Frank Duda Memorial Interchange KIA WWII U.S.M.C.
- The interchange of U.S. Route 40 with State Route 4035 in Fayette County as the Corporal Denny Ray Easter Memorial Interchange KIA Vietnam War U.S. Army.

PennDOT shall be responsible for erecting and maintaining signs displaying these designations to traffic in both directions.

FISCAL IMPACT: According to PennDOT, installation of two signs, one in each direction, dedicating a bridge, highway or interchange costs \$500. Since there are 18 designations within this legislation, the total cost would be roughly \$9,000. This cost can be absorbed in current allocated funds.
