**SUMMARY:** Changes the member composition of the Port of Pittsburgh Commission Board. This legislation would take effect in 60 days.

**ANALYSIS:** This legislation amends Act 133 of 1992 by reducing the Port of Pittsburgh Commission from 15 members to 13 by retaining the current four legislative appointments as well as the four members appointed by the Governor.

The remaining five members would be as follows:

- Three members appointed by the Governor from a list of at least five nominees submitted by the Southwestern Pennsylvania Regional Planning Commission.
- One member nominated by the Port of Pittsburgh's Executive Committee and appointed by the Port's Board.
- One member appointed by the Governor from a list of at least three nominees submitted to the Governor by the Port's Board.

The legislation adds Cambria County to the definition of "Port District".

This legislation also updates references to the Right-to-Know Law, Public Official and Employee Ethics Act, and the Sunshine Act.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds. The governing body of the commission is currently comprised of 15 members, and the proposed legislation reduces that number to 13. The commission may realize modest savings as a result of the reduction in the number of commission members.
