SUMMARY:

House Bill 817 Printer's Number 774 amends the act of September 27, 1961, known as the Pharmacy Act, expanding the duties of the State Board of Pharmacy to include education on a pharmacy's ability to modify their registration to collect and destroy prescription drugs.

ANALYSIS:

The act of September 27, 1961 established the State Board of Pharmacy and provides for its powers and duties. This bill adds the following to the list of the Board's powers:

- Educating pharmacies about their ability to modify their registration with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (USDEA) to receive and destroy mail-back packages and to install, manage and maintain collection receptacles for prescription drugs.
- Recommending that pharmacies modify their registration with the USDEA to receive and destroy prescription drugs.

This legislation takes effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This legislation has no fiscal impact as it only adds duties to the already established State Board of Pharmacy. The additional duties of the Board can be carried out using existing staff and resources.
