### SUMMARY:

Senate Bill 910 amends Title 63 (Professions and Occupations (State Licensed)) to provide for the expungement of certain civil penalties.

### ANALYSIS:

This bill allows for the expungement of a disciplinary record of a licensee, registrant, certificate holder or permit holder for a violation otherwise specified in the schedule of civil penalties under paragraph 1 of §3108. It also changes the time requirement for a licensee, registrant, certificate holder or permit holder to apply for expungement from not early than four years from the final disposition of the disciplinary record to not early than five years from the final disposition of the disciplinary record.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill will have no impact on Commonwealth funds. The Department of State believes they can accommodate an increase in the number of applications for expungement with current resources.
