DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

Senate Bill 302 changes the eligibility requirements for reduced fees for hunting licenses from 180 days of active deployment to 60 days within the previous 24 month period for the members of the Pennsylvania National Guard, Air National Guard, or Reservists. The fees are reduced from the current full license fee of \$19 to \$1.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Game Commission is unable to estimate the impact of the more liberal eligibility provision for these persons. However, it could be assumed that the Game Commission's experience may be similar to the Fish Commission's estimate for similar provisions in SB 301. The Fish Commission estimates about 25 – 50 additional persons who may be eligible and take advantage of the reduced fee.

Reducing the hunting license fee to \$1 would reduce revenue by \$18 per person. Therefore, the reduced fee could result in decreased revenue to the Game Fund of \$450 to \$900.
