DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 1868 amends the Cosmetology Law to allow students in cosmetology schools to take the written portion of their various licensing examinations prior to completion of their schooling.

The bill will allow cosmetology students to take the theoretical part of the cosmetologist licensing examination upon completion of at least 900 hours of instruction. It allows applicants for a cosmetology teacher's license to take the theoretical part of the teacher's licensing examination upon completion of at least 400 hours of instruction.

FISCAL NOTE

The bill amends Section 5 of the Act which relates to limited licenses to allow esthetician students and natural hair braiding students to take the theoretical part of their licensing examinations upon completion of at least 250 hours of instruction. It allows nail technician students to take the theoretical part of their examination after 150 hours of instruction.

The act will take effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact to the Commonwealth is expected to result from the passage of this legislation.
