DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 1934 amends Act 101 of 1988, the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling, and Waste Reduction Act, to exclude the population of a state or federal facility that conducts a recycling program administered by a state or federal government from the municipality's total population count when this count is used to determine a municipality's required compliance with the recycling law.

The act takes effect in 60 days.

FISCAL NOTE

FISCAL IMPACT:

The enactment of this legislation will have no negative fiscal impact to the Commonwealth Recycling Fund or local municipalities. Municipalities whose population is above the threshold requiring implementation of a recycling program due to the inclusion of prisoner populations, would be exempted from establishing a recycling program. Such municipalities would not incur start-up, operational or administrative costs associated with the establishment of a recycling program.
