**DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL**

Senate Bill 1067 amends §102 of Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes further defining "emergency vehicle."

Specifically, this legislation broadens the definition of "emergency vehicle" to include vehicles owned by a county or regional police association and operated by a police officer, as currently defined in §102 of Title 75, that is used for police transport or victim extraction, and any vehicle operated by a special agent, special agent supervisor, narcotics agent or narcotics agent supervisor while performing official duties as employees of the Office of Attorney General.

The effective date would be 60 days.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The enactment of this legislation would have no adverse fiscal impact on Commonwealth funds.
