DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF BILL

House Bill 818 amends Title 40 (Insurance) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for compliance with Federal health care legislation by prohibiting certain abortion coverage in qualified health plans offered through the health insurance exchange.

Authorizes the Commonwealth pursuant to authority granted under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act to prohibit certain abortion coverage in qualified health plans offered through the health insurance exchange.

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Prohibits any qualified health plan offered in the Commonwealth through the health insurance exchange from including coverage for the performance of any abortion unless the abortion is necessary to avert the death of the mother, the pregnancy was caused by rape or the pregnancy was caused by incest.

No qualified health plan offered through a health insurance exchange shall exclude coverage for treatment of any post-abortion complication.

Permits an individual to purchase optional supplemental coverage for an abortion with a separate premium for the coverage and the coverage must be obtained outside the insurance exchange.

The act is shall take effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 818 will have no fiscal impact to the Commonwealth.
